HISTORY OF WOOD BADGE

Wood Badge leadership training was originally presented by Lord Baden-Powell for Scouters throughout the world. In recognizing the first Scouters to complete the program, he awarded each individual a wooden bead on a leather thong to be worn around the neck. Today, upon successful completion of the Wood Badge training, a Scouter receives his or her certification, two beads on a leather thong, a neckerchief and woggle and becomes a permanent member of Gilwell Troop 1.

What is Wood Badge all about?

Wood Badge is a leadership course that completes Scouting's Basic Leadership Training program for all levels of Scouting (Cub Scouts, Boy Scouts, Varsity Scouts and Venturing). The concepts are the same as the youth leaders who attend National Youth Leader Training learn, so you are better prepared to work with them in your units. Wood Badge consists of two parts:



Part 1

The first part is a six day learning experience taught over two weekends. During this time, participants are trained in and practice leadership skills to better serve the Scouting units in which they are involved. Through this experience each person develops knowledge and understanding of these leadership skills. This team development and leadership model will provide an invaluable tool in all aspects of your Scouting, personal and business life. You will develop a personal motivation to apply these skills in your Scouting position.

Part 2

The second part occurs after the six days of training. Participants will put into practice the leadership skills learned by completing a set of personal goals made during the course. These goals are known as the Wood Badge "ticket." Upon successful completion of the Wood Badge course and ticket the participant will receive a certificate and the distinctive neckerchief, woggle, and beads. The Wood Badge "ticket" represents the participant's commitment to completing a set of goals related to that individual's Scouting position. The time period before your final completion of the "ticket" will be a minimum of 6 months and a maximum of 18 months following the course.

PREREQUISITES:

- Be a registered member of the BSA.
- Complete the required training for your position and have current Youth Protection training
- Be capable of functioning safely in an outdoor environment.
- A physical is required bring a completed BSA health form parts A, B, and C.
- Course fee: \$275 (Early bird fee \$250 if paid in full by May 15th. Fee increases to \$300 if not paid by Aug.1st)
- Limit of 48 participants
- Two weekends-6 total days
- Sessions begin at 7:30 am & end at 5 pm
- Attendance is required all six days
