

You can qualify for a cool new patch just by taking care of some paperwork during registration time. Good luck. I'm looking forward to seeing lots of Gold units in our Council this year.

One last thing, I've noticed that there sure doesn't seem to be a lot of Service Hours getting tracked for units that I know are busy making their part of the Council awesome. If you don't know how to log your unit's service hours, that's another item to discuss with your Unit Commissioner. They can show you how to do it. You, the unit leader, are the only person that can actually log those hours for your unit. Remember to track total hours for this. For example, if you a Den Leader take six Wolf Cub Scouts down to the park and pick up trash and pull some weeds, remember that your hour, your Assistant Den Leader's hour, your Den Chief's hour, your six Wolfs' hour, and their six parent's hour counts for a total of

twelve hours! It's not just one hour (this also works for Eagle Projects too, Scoutmasters and Team Coaches). Venture hours get counted this way too.

Continue to report your unit's Service Hours for JTE throughout the year. Service hours are an essential part of the Journey to Excellence program as well as being a significant part of what we do in Scouting. Remember, only the total number of hours for Eagle Projects are added through the Eagle application process so the unit should log in to update the report as to the number of people involved, value of materials, and the organization benefitting from the project.
